with support from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Denmark Key Definitions: Violence Against Women (VAW) is a violation of all laws, moral and societal values. It is unacceptable since it has harmful health and psychosocial effect on women, children and families.

Violence against women is not a mere family issue because it undermines women and their security. Violence is not settled through silence, which – to the contrary – will trigger further and harder violence with time.

Several institutions in Palestine offer emergency intervention and protection services to women who face all forms of violence (physical, sexual, psychological, economic or social).

This booklet provides information on institutions providing emergency assistance and social, legal and economic support to women victims of violence. These institutions include, but are not limited to, the Directorates of Social Affairs, Family Protection Units within the Palestinian Civil Police, UNRWA's Mental Health Programs, Women's Center for Legal Aid and Counselling (WCLAC), Palestinian Working Woman Society for Development (PWWSD), SAWA (Counselling hotline). They also encompass institutions working in the southern governorates of the Gaza Strip, which include the Gaza Community Mental Health Program (GCMHP), UNRWA Gender Initiative, Women's Affairs Center, Union of Health Working Committees, Culture and Free Thought Association, Avsha Association for Protection of Women and Children. Wifag Society for Care of Women and Children, Palestinian Center for Human Rights, Palestine Red Crescent Society -Gaza Strip, Women Health Center - Gaza Strip, Palestinian Center for Democracy and Conflict Resolution, and Center for Women's Legal Research and Counseling.





Family Protection Unit (Palestinian Civil Police)

The establishment of Family Protection Units (FPU) started on 7 October 2008 in the Governorate of Bethlehem and expanded into West Bank Governorates to respond to the needs of victims of violence and to the vision of Violence-Free Families. FPUs provide protection and support in emergency cases to help women victims of violence and raise local community awareness that violence constitutes a crime. They aim to achieve families free of violence where all members enjoy their rights and freedoms. Their mandate includes:

1. Receive complaints from women and children victims of violence and from delinguent juveniles for referral to the public prosecution.

- Follow-up on cases that require referral to shelters.
- Provide awareness and counselling services to schools, universities and parents to inform them of the vision, role and responsibilities of the FPUs and raise their awareness of the risks of domestic and family violence.

UNRWA

UNRWA provides services to Palestinian refugees in the camps including education, relief and health care as well as community and mental health and family and child protection services. 
Women's Center for Legal Aid and Counselling (WCLAC)






