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Results of Palestinian Public Opinion Polls
No 13
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The Background:

As the time for the intended Israeli pull out from the Gaza Strip approaches, the Palestinian Authority has begun intensive movements to rearrange the local Palestinian conditions in anticipation of the aftermath of the withdrawal. In this context the Palestinian President held several meetings with the leaders of the Palestinian factions whom he had earlier invited to join a Palestinian national coalition government. Several of these factions such as Hamas, Islamic Jihad and the Public Front refused the President's call and proposed the formation of a national committee to supervise the Israeli pull-out from the Strip; the PA rejected the proposal through different statements made by more than one PA official. On the other side of the scene, the PA intensified its efforts to control the local security situation when several cases of outlaw incidents were cited. Outlaw incidents have not become single and isolated ones; they have become a phenomenon that threatens the whole Palestinian society. Such chaotic conditions prompted officials and public Palestinians moves to put an end to this phenomenon; these moves are exemplified in the decision made by the Council of Ministers and the Ministry of Interior Affairs.

On the local level, the Palestinian Legislative Council ratified the Law of Legislative Elections which is based on the Mixed Elections System and that increased the number of PLC members to 132; half of them are to be chosen on the basis of the elections circles system and the other on the basis of national tickets. Upon passing the elections law the Palestinian Authority promised to conduct the legislative elections either at the end of this year or at the beginning of the coming year.

The Results:

Following are the results of Palestinian Public Opinion Poll no.13 conducted by the Center of Opinion Polls and Survey Studies at An-Najah National University during the period from July 13-15, 2005. **The University sponsors all polls conducted by its Center.**

Poll no. 13 undertakes several subjects centered basically around the call made by the PA to the national and Islamic factions to join a national coalition government, the chaotic outlaw situation, the Israeli pull out from the Gaza Strip, the coming Palestinian LC elections, an assessment of the performance of the institutions of the PA, the status of democracy and human rights in the West Bank and Gaza, in addition to political affiliations and other issues.

The sample included 1360 persons whose age group is 18 years and above and who have the right to vote. The sample forms one per thousand from among the total number of Palestinian people of this age group. The enclosed questionnaire was distributed on 860 persons from the West Bank and 500 persons from the Gaza Strip. The sample was drawn randomly and the margin of error is about $\pm 3\%$. Still 1.6% of the numbers of the sample refused to answer the questionnaire.

Major Results:

- 84.9% from among respondents support the call made by the PA to the national and Islamic factions to join a national coalition government, while 11.2% reject it.
- 75.1% from among respondents support the participation of Hamas in a national coalition government and 20% and reject it.
- 29.1% from among respondents support Hamas' rejection to join a national coalition government.
- 58.1% from among respondents believe that the PA is serious in its call for the formation of a national coalition government, while 30.7% say that the PA is not serious.
- 61.3% from among respondents believe that the formation of a national coalition government will exit the Palestinians from the current political crisis, and 32.4% say that it will not.
- 51% from among respondents say that the refusal of some Palestinian factions to join a national coalition government serves these factions' private interests and 32.5% say it will serve the interest of the Palestinian people.
- 68.5% believe that the formation of a united national coalition government will limit the chaotic security phenomenon in Palestinian streets while 25% say it will not.
- 38.9% from among respondents believe that the formation of a national coalition government will be a pretext to postpone the legislative elections.
- 77.6% support the suggestion made by Palestinian factions to form a national committee to supervise Israeli pull out from the Gaza Strip and 16.5% reject it.



- 40.7% say that the Palestinian officials are serious in their fight of the outlaw and chaotic situation and 50.2% say the opposite.
- 27.8% believe that the Palestinian security apparatuses are incapable of imposing order on Palestinian streets.
- 70.3% say that the Palestinian security apparatuses are themselves part of the chaos in Palestinian streets.
- Putting an end to the security outlaw state is assessed as “good” by the following bodies with the corresponding percentages: the Ministers Council 20.6%, the LC 20.1%, the security apparatuses 16%, the reform committees 35.2%, the private institutions 30.5%, the political parties 21.5% and the pressure exerted by the public is given 25.4%.
- 43.9% from among respondents believe that the Israeli pull out from the Gaza Strip is an Israeli substitute for the Road Map.
- 39.9% from among respondents believe that the Israeli pull out from the Gaza Strip came as a result of the pressure made by Palestinian resistance.
- 50% from among respondents say that the behavior of the PA towards the Israeli pull out from the Gaza Strip is ‘good’.
- 32.6% from among respondents believe that the disengagement plan will lead to an escalation in Palestinian internal strife.
- 58.8% from among respondents believe that the disengagement plan will push Palestinian people towards reinforcing their national unity.
- 39.7% from among respondents support launching attacks against Israeli targets from the Gaza Strip after the Israeli withdrawal; 51.9% reject them.
- 49.5% from among respondents say that the political and economic conditions will improve after the Israeli pull out from the Gaza Strip; 16.6% say that they will deteriorate.
- 2.1% will reelect the same members of the current Legislative Council; 18.4% will not reelect any one of them.

- The basic principle that will define the attitudes of voters in giving their vote to a candidate will be personal acquaintance with a percentage of, 25.6% followed by belongingness to a party with a percentage of 24%.
- 25.1% from among respondents will vote for a Fateh block in the coming LC elections, 21.9% will vote for Hamas, and 5.4% will vote for a block from among members of the Palestinian left.
- If the Palestinian voters in the coming LC elections were limited to a choice of two blocks, one representing the PLO and one representing Hamas, respondents who vote for the PLO are 45.1%, and those who vote for Hamas are 34.5%.
- If the Palestinian voters in the coming LC elections were limited to a choice between two blocks; one representing Fateh and one representing Hamas, respondents who give their votes to Fateh are 40.2% and those who give their votes to Hamas are 35.2%.
- 28.5% from among respondents will not reelect all or some members from the present LC members because of their abuse of public funds, 24.6% because of the appointment of their relatives in public positions, 31.1% because of being remote from the problems and worries of the people of the elections circles that they represent, and 6.1% because these representatives have never visited their elections circles since their election.
- The percentage of respondents who evaluate the performance of Palestinian Presidential Institution as “good” and “fair” is 69.6%, the Palestinian Government is 64%, the LC is 52.9%, the Palestinian judicious system is 59.7% , and the Palestinian security apparatuses is 49.9%.
- The following percentages represent respondents belief that President Mahmoud Abbas began practical and tangible steps in the following domains:

- 71.1% from among respondents support the creation of a vice president position.
- 32.4% from among respondents believe that turning some of the files of corruption to the Attorney General is just a start for questioning top officials in the PA who are believed to be involved in cases of financial and administrative corruption.
- 19.9% believe that the state of democracy in Palestine is good; 30.7% say it is bad.
- 26% say that the political system in Palestine is proceeding towards building a democratic system.
- 28.7% say that the political system in Palestine is proceeding towards respecting human rights.
- 17.6% from among respondents evaluate respect paid to human rights in Palestine by the PA as “good”.
- 35.4% assess respect paid to the freedom of press by the Palestinian Authority as ‘good’.
- 49.4% from among respondents say that they are able to criticize the policies of the PA without fear.
- 45.5% from among respondents say that they express their general political opinions without fear.
- 42.1% from among respondents believe that the Palestinian social system gives them the freedom to adopt any religion or thought they choose, while 32.8% say the contrary.
- 69% from among respondents believe that the Government’s expenditures on the education sector are not enough to meet the educational needs, and 72.5% believe that the expenditures on the health sector are also not enough and so are the expenditures on social welfare with a 69.4%.
- 55.4% from among respondents do not feel safe neither for themselves nor for their families and properties.
- 71.8% from among respondents read Palestinian daily newspapers and AlQuds Newspaper is the most read one.
- 51.9% say that the big industrial countries will fulfill their financial commitments that they made to the Palestinians.
- If these industrial countries fulfill their obligations, 25.4% from among respondents believe that the fund paid will be directed to develop the Palestinian economy; 61.3% believe the contrary.
- 21% believe that such funds if paid will lead to a drop in the percentage of unemployment and 10.1% believe that it will lead to a reduction in the percentage of poverty.
