Comparative actual spending report for the Ministry of Women's Affairs 2024–2025

In accordance with the 2025 Ministry of Finance actual spending report, actual expenditures allocated to the Ministry of Women's Affairs were **ILS7.81 million** of a total **ILS17,202.8 million** from overall actual spending in the 2025 budget, or **0.05%** of overall expenditures. [1]

According to the 2024 annual actual spending report by the Ministry of Finance, actual spending allocated to the Ministry of Women's Affairs was **ILS 8.51 million** of **NIS17,518.8 million** of the 2024 overall annual actual spending from the public budget, or **0.05%** of overall expenditures. The table below illustrates comparative figures for annual actual spending items for 2024–2025 for the Ministry of Women's Affairs:

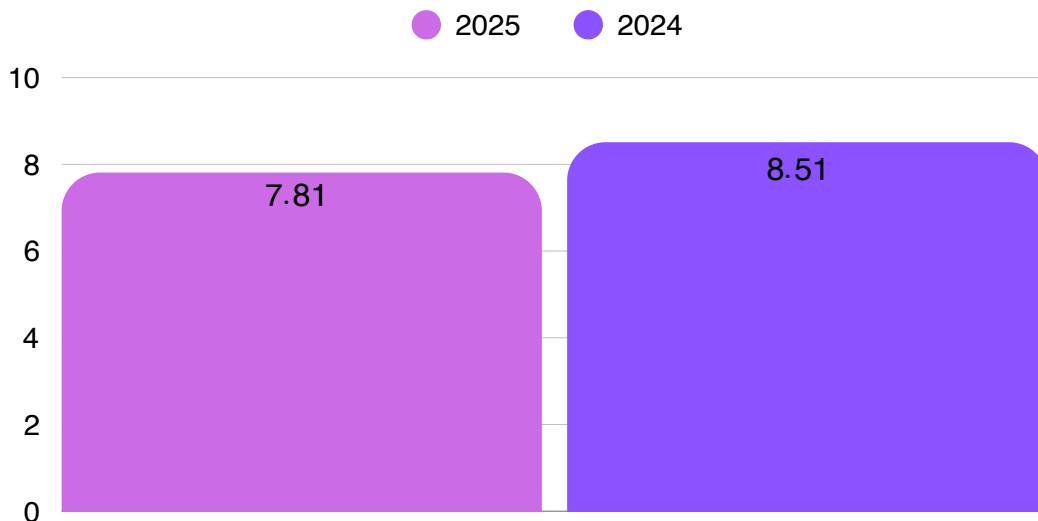

Note: the abovementioned figures are on an accrual basis; that is the value of salaries and wages are those committed to by the Ministry of Finance to employees and not on a cash-basis, due to the disbursement of a percentage of salary since the end of 2021.

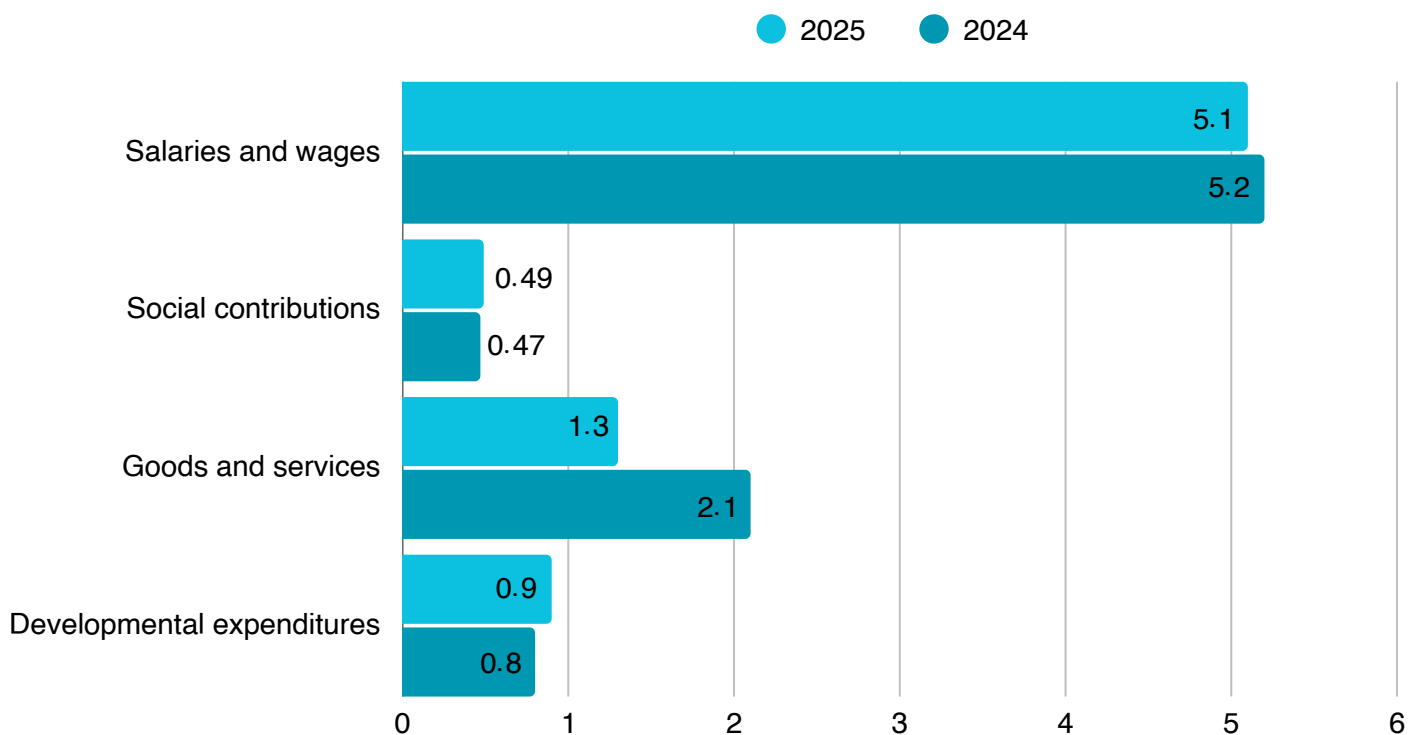

Comparative annual actual spending for 2024–2025 for the Ministry of Women's Affairs/million shekels

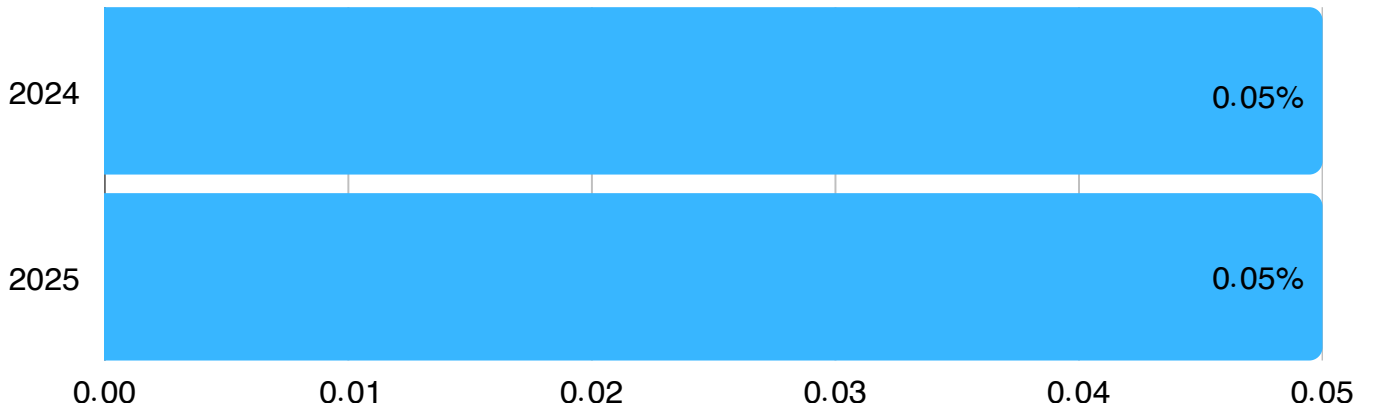


Comparative annual actual spending for 2024–2025 for the Ministry of Women's Affairs according to item/million shekels

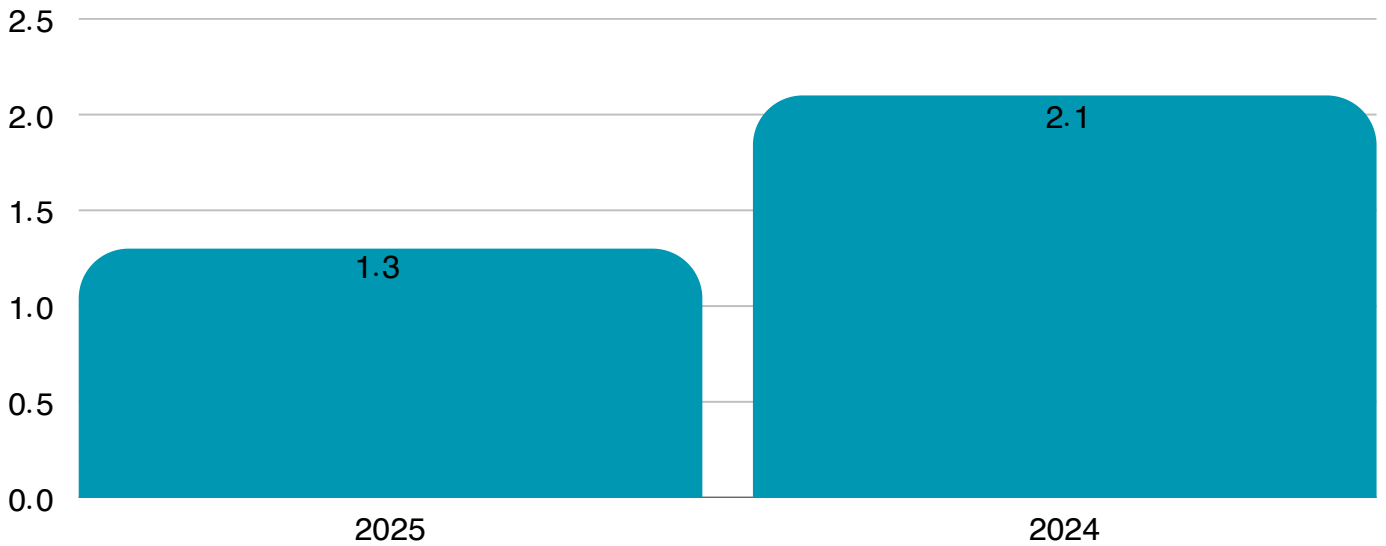

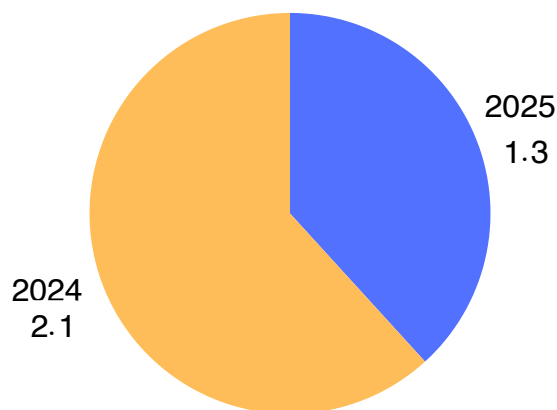
Percentage of annual actual spending for the Ministry of Women's Affairs from the overall public expenditures for 2024/2025

Analysis of annual comparative actual spending figures for the Ministry of Women's Affairs 2024–2025:

One: Actual annual spending for the Ministry of Women's Affairs dropped in 2025, going from ILS8.51 million in 2024 to ILS7.81 million in 2025.

Two: The percentage of actual spending at the Ministry of Women's Affairs remained the same in 2025 from overall public expenditures in Palestine, compared to 2024, at around 0.05% of overall expenditures for both 2024 and 2025.

Three: There was drop in actual spending in 2025 on the items: salaries and wages and goods and services.

Four: Operational expenditures "goods and services" decreased in 2025 compared to 2024, going from ILS2,1 million to ILS1.3 million in 2025.

Five: Developmental expenditures slightly increased, going from ILS0.8 million in 2024 to ILS0.9 million in 2025.

Conclusion: It can be noted from the from the comparative actual spending analysis for the Ministry of Women's Affairs in 2024–2025 that actual spending decreased in 2025 compared to 2024, at the level of actual spending, while the 'share" of the Ministry of Women's Affairs remained around 0.05% of overall public expenditures for 2024/2025. The decrease was mostly on salaries and wages and goods and services in 2025, compared to 2024, noting that the figures in the report are on an accrual basis.

Important Terms:

Expenditures: Includes current as well as capital and developmental expenditures

Current expenditures: Includes salaries, wages, social contributions, operational and transfer expenditures

Salaries and wages: Salaries and wages of Ministry employees

Social contributions: Represents the government's contribution to the General Pension and Social Security Authority for pensioners

Operational costs for “goods and services”: the necessary expenditures for the operation of the public institution, i.e. the Ministry (building rentals, electricity, water, fuel, etc.).

Transfer (referral) expenditures: are the expenditures paid by the government to different societal segments through a public institution for the benefit of a third party (such as payments to assist the poor or to martyrs' families).

Capital expenditures: includes the possession of capital assets (buildings, land, equipment, vehicles, etc.)

Developmental expenditures: are expenditures which have a nature that is different from current expenditures in terms of their useful life and the return from expenditures, whereas their useful life and the return/yield extend beyond one year.

Cash-basis: The method which financial and accounting transactions are conducted upon cash payment of cash receipt, i.e. it focuses on cash flow activity whereby financial operations are not registered in the books until after collection or the cash payment of the due amount is paid.

Accrual basis: The method in which data and accounting in transactions are registered on the date of the occurrence irrespective of cash payment or receipt.
